**GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING
MINUTES FOR
WEDNESDAY JANUARY 30, 2019**

Gene opened the meeting at 7:00 P.M. and reminded members that their dues is now due for 2019. He told members of the sad passing of Mr. Gerald Armand's wife and that John Scallan was sick and having some tests done. He said to please keep them in our prayers.

Gene said that Dickey has booked the Castine Center for the next 3 years for our Festival.

A member brought up the question of what could be done by carvers who wanted to enter their gunning birds, but did not want to enter Divisions IV and V Purchase Award categories. After much discussion it was decided that we create a DIVISION IV-B and DIVISION V-B, which will offer "Just Ribbon Awards".

Gene asked if there were any nominations for officers of board and reminded members that they would be closed at the end of this meeting.

Mr., Harvey Lewis who wrote a book on "Carvers and their decoys" is writing his second book about the different types of decoy carving. He visited with members tonight and said he is trying to keep our Legacy alive and this book will be about the Artistry of Louisiana Decoys. He is planning to write a section on Bryan Chermie and Bill Hanemann and he is reaching out to carv-

ers and collectors for their input, information, opinions, etc. He will be discussing decorative gunners, slicks antique decoys and contemporary decoys. He also discussed replica's of contemporary (new carvings in the style of the old times). It was recommended that these carvers put their names permanently on the decoy when it is carved to distinguish it from the original carvers of the birds. Mr. Harvey said he was trying to take folk-art out of the marsh and into collector homes to make them more aware. Decorative decoys would bring the wildlife into peoples homes so that they would appreciate and love nature.

A young movie producer with PBS visited with us. She was looking for information for a movie she is making on the culture of duck hunting in Louisiana. She said she had filmed 10 duck hunts. The shows will air on Channel Twelve sometime this year.

The show is once again coming up at the Academy's Whale Fest on Friday March 29th; carvings, carvers and demonstrations are needed for display. See Dickey for further information.

The State Convention for Ducks Unlimited will be held this year in Thibodaux, La.
