GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES FOR WEDNESDAY MAY 29, 2019

Gene opened the meeting by introducing and welcoming guests. Mr. Ruth brought a family member Mr. Jimmy Fried, a WWII Veteran wounded at the Battle of the Bulge with General Paton's Army. Gene also welcomed Mr. Eric Hutchinson, a long time member and carver. His dad was one of the founders of our club, He then welcomed members Dr. Ken Margolis and his wife Judy from Maryland.

Gene reminded everyone that our shows coming up and asked Richard to give a report on the Ward Show. Mitch took a Best in Show and Lonie took a Second Best in Show. He said we got a lot of response from people about our show.

Gene reminded us that the Cajun Heritage Festival is on June 8th and 9th. He said he will take a table there. Ducks unlimited is in July and he called for a table there and Gene will donate a decoy. Blue Bonnet Festival in Baton Rouge is on the 19th of August and they will be honoring Curt Fabre.

It was suggested that we update our current club shirts with a little nicer fabric. We will have more information at the next meeting.

Gene thanked Lydia for volunteering to help Dickey with our sponsors. Lydia brought up attendance at our show and said she thinks that most of the attendance at our show was from Slidell and Mississippi. Chris said he thinks advertising on the Don Dubuc Show and 2 hunting and fishing magazines, Bayou Wild and Hunting & Fishing helps attendance. Dickey said we have been doing them for a

while. Lydia said Don Dubuc came to the show this year, Gene said he has been there for 2 years.

Gene said Decoy Magazine contacted him and asked if we wanted to do an ad like we did last year. Kathy suggested that we put on our post cards we send out a free entry if they bring the card with them to the show. It was decided that we will put a \$2.00 discount off the entry into the show on the post card this year.

Mike suggested we need a graph over the years showing the increasing or decreasing in categories, carving attendance, states attendance, etc. A member said that he felt the TV ads helped attendance. Members agreed and it was decided that we will do the TV ads again this year. It was voted on and approved.

It was brought up that if we can get our auction pieces in earlier we could advertise them before the show. Mike said we've never been able to get it done. The Auction would start off with that bid. This was tabled till next meeting. Oschner Hospital will once again be displaying our carvings.
