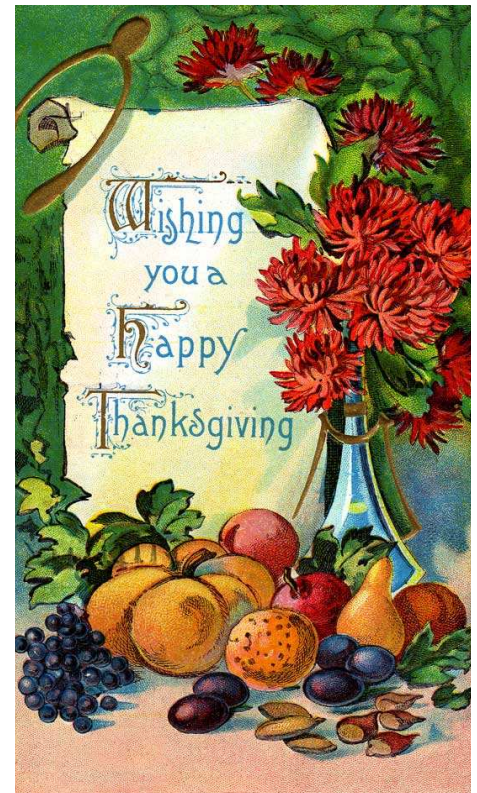

**MINUTES —GENERAL
MEMBERSHIP MEETING —
OCTOBER 27, 2010**

CHANGES IN RULES FOR 2011 FESTIVAL : The Board and Rules Committee decided that a carver should be allowed to put a bird he has entered in another category into a Purchase Award Category only ; if he so chooses. It was agreed upon by all. There was some confusion about minimum bids of Auction items. Therefore the 2011 Rules Book will include an application for all Auction pieces which will include a space for the minimum bid if a carver wishes to put one on his carving.

DONATION FROM GATE PROCEEDS: The Board approved a \$300 donation to either preserving our wetlands or helping our wildlife from the gate proceeds of our Festival.

NEW VENDOR TABLE PRICES FOR NEXT YEAR: It was decided by the Board that it would be easier and more reasonable to set one price of \$60 each for tables for members at the 2011 Festival. Non- member prices for vendor tables will remain the same.

SECURITY FOR 2011 FESTIVAL: The board discussed and recommended that the additional overnight security guard be dropped for next year. The building is equipped with double alarm systems inside and out, including a motion detector. In addition a Security Guard patrols the grounds all night. This will save us \$900 in expense. It was voted on by the Board and passed.

UP-DATE ON SHOW FINANCES: Dickey, our treasurer, gave a report on the Festival finances. The show made a profit of approximately \$6,000 which is more than last year. Also our Auction brought in twice as much as last year. Mr. Charles Frank reminded members that we had \$40,000 dollars in prize money; more than any other show.

NEW NORTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIP CATEGORY: This was the first year for this category which was won by Richard Reeves, and there were some nice entries. Next year we are expecting more as word travels, the entries will increase.

BANQUET: The Member of the Year Banquet will be held at Piccadilly on December 28th; the last Wednesday in December. The meal will be free to a member and their guest.

CURT FARBE INJURED: Curt injured his shoulder while he was riding as a passenger on a 4 wheeler. He suffered a broken collar bone and had to have surgery. Please let him know you are thinking about him and wish him a speedy recovery.

LOSS OF MEMBER & FRIEND: Long time member Joe Courselle passed away this week after a lengthy illness. The funeral will be on Saturday on the West Bank. He will be missed by all. Please remember his family in your prayers.

EARLINE BORDELON: We have been trying to locate Earline Bordelon, if anyone knows where she is residing or how we may be able to contact her, we would appreciate you let-

ting Richard or one of our Board members know.

OTHER CARVING SHOWS: Richard encouraged everyone to attend and support the Houma Show on March 25th and 26th & 27th, 2011 and the Ohio Show, weekend of March 12th, 2011.

IDEAS FOR NEXT YEAR'S FESTIVAL: A member asked about getting T-Shirts for the 2011 Festival. Richard said we will look into possibly getting shirts for next year. Another member asked about a Competition Magazine. Richard said that there are some issues to consider about a magazine; first we would need a volunteer (someone to put the magazine together and edit it. This is a very time consuming job). Also it is very expensive to produce a decent magazine. If we get a volunteer, will look into the matter further.

Since there was no further business, motion was made by Dick Bonner and seconded by Dickey Autin to a adjoin the meeting at 7:45 PM .
